

HOLY LOVE – RESTORING GOD'S DESIGN

*...Beloved, let us cleanse ourselves from
all filthiness of the flesh and spirit,

24-7 PRAYER FOR REVIVAL 15-21 September 2025

Globally, many have drifted from God's beautiful design for love and marriage. Marital intimacy, created by God as a covenant of purity, unity and fruitfulness between husband and wife, is often treated casually or distorted by culture. Yet the Lord calls His people back to holiness.

As we pray together this week, may our hearts be realigned with God's design, our homes strengthened and Christ's glory revealed in families and nations.

MONDAY 15 SEPTEMBER 2025

GOD DESIGNED LOVE AS A HOLY COVENANT

*Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife and they shall become one flesh.
(Genesis 2:24).*

From the beginning, God established marriage as a sacred covenant. Adam and Eve's oneness reflected His purpose for intimacy: purity, unity and fruitfulness. People today often treat intimacy as recreation rather than a sacred act. But God's Word calls us back to His holy design.

Let us pray

- Pray that couples will reject cultural distortions and embrace God's Word as the foundation of their union. Ask that marriages be realigned with His original design for holiness and covenant love.
- Ask the Lord to restore purity, joy and fruitfulness in marriages across this generation, that they may shine as testimonies of His faithfulness and truth.

Practical tip: Encourage a young couple to pursue marriage preparation rooted in Scripture.

TUESDAY 16 SEPTEMBER 2025

HONOUR GOD WITH YOUR BODY

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. (Romans 12:1).

Our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. Paul reminds us that immorality uniquely defiles the body, yet God's people are called to holiness. Temptations are amplified, but His Word still stands as our guide.

Let us pray

- Pray that couples would honour their bodies as holy, treating them as vessels for God's glory and instruments of His service.
- Ask the Lord to cleanse households from hidden sin and establish a spirit of holiness in every home, so that families become sanctuaries of His presence and testimonies of His purity.

Practical tip: Pray with someone who struggles with temptation, reminding them of their worth and victory in Christ and through the power of the Holy Spirit.

WEDNESDAY 17 SEPTEMBER 2025

LUST DESTROYS, BUT REPENTANCE RESTORES

Then David sent messengers and took her; and she came to him and he lay with her... (2 Samuel 11:4).

King David, chosen by God, gave way to desire and fell into adultery with Bathsheba. Lust leads to destruction, but repentance opens the door to restoration. God's mercy can heal where sin has wounded.

Let us pray

- Pray for a spirit of deep repentance wherever hearts have strayed, that those bound by sin would turn back to the Lord and find mercy.
- Ask the Lord to bring transparency into marriages and families, breaking secrecy and shame, and releasing healing, reconciliation and renewed intimacy.

Practical tip: Share a Scripture on purity (e.g. Matthew 5:8) with someone who needs encouragement.

THURSDAY 18 SEPTEMBER 2025

LOVE THAT REDEEMS

Then the Lord said to me, "Go again, love a woman who is loved by a lover and is committing adultery..." (Hosea 3:1).

Hosea's redemption of Gomer mirrored God's unfailing love for His people. Even when love is betrayed, God shows us that forgiveness and restoration are possible through His grace.

Let us pray

- Pray that God's redeeming love will reach into marriages scarred by betrayal, bringing supernatural healing and restoration.
- Ask for humility, forgiveness and grace to replace bitterness and pride, so that couples may rebuild trust and reflect the redeeming power of Christ.

Practical tip: Be a compassionate listener to a couple facing struggles.

FRIDAY 19 SEPTEMBER 2025

HONOUR MARRIAGE AS SACRED

Marriage is honourable among all and the bed undefiled; but fornicators and adulterers God will judge. (Hebrews 13:4).

Marriage is to be honoured by all. God calls His people to preserve their purity and protect it from compromise. When marriage is held sacred, it becomes a witness to God's love.

Let us pray

- Pray for marriages to be shielded from the snares of impurity, pornography, hidden sin and unfaithfulness that they may walk in integrity before the Lord.
- Ask God to restore broken trust and establish marriages in truth and grace, making them living witnesses of His covenant love to the world.

Practical tip: Speak words of blessing and encouragement over a couple you know.

SATURDAY 20 SEPTEMBER 2025

SERVE ONE ANOTHER IN LOVE

Let the husband render to his wife the affection due her and likewise also the wife to her husband. (1 Corinthians 7:3).

God designed marital intimacy to be mutual and selfless, reflecting Christ's love. True intimacy flourishes through service, humility and honour toward one another.

Let us pray

- Pray that marriages would be filled with a spirit of servanthood, where spouses serve one another with humility, love and joy.
- Ask God to renew intimacy as a place of healing, encouragement and restoration, drawing couples back to their first love for Him and for each other.

Practical tip: Serve a couple you're praying for with a meal or babysitting.

SUNDAY 21 SEPTEMBER 2025

MARRIAGE: A MYSTERY OF CHRIST AND THE CHURCH

"FOR THIS REASON A MAN SHALL LEAVE HIS FATHER AND MOTHER AND BE JOINED TO HIS WIFE and THE TWO SHALL BECOME ONE FLESH."... (Ephesians 5:31-32).

Marriage is a mystery that reflects Christ's covenant love for His Church, His Bride. Christ-centred marriages become beacons of purity and worship in a broken world.

Let us pray

- Pray for couples to be united in spiritual purpose, building marriages that reflect the sacrificial love of Christ and shine as a testimony of His Gospel.
- Ask for Jesus to be enthroned as Lord in every home, as the third strand in the cord of every covenant marriage and the source of their strength and joy (Ecclesiastes 4:12).

Practical tip: Share communion or read Scripture (e.g., Psalm 127:1) with a couple, reminding them to keep Christ central in their relationship.
