31 AUGUST – 6 SEPTEMBER 2026

Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God!
(1 John 3:1a)

The Father's love is personal, steadfast and revealed through His Son, Jesus Christ. Yet many, including a fatherless generation, struggle to understand what it means to be deeply loved by Him.

Join us for part one of the three-part series as we receive the Father's love afresh and ask the Holy Spirit to transform us, so that His love becomes tangible through our words, actions and relationships, and through His Church to a world longing to belong.

MONDAY 31 AUGUST 2026

LOVED BY THE FATHER

"The Father Himself loves you, because you have loved Me, and have believed that I came forth from God."
(John 16:27).

Many know God loves them, yet struggle to experience His love personally. Rejection and painful relationships can distort how we see our heavenly Father. Jesus revealed a Father who loves His children personally. Receiving His love changes how we see ourselves and others.

Let us pray

- Ask the Father to help you receive His love deeply and demonstrate it by noticing, encouraging and caring for those who feel forgotten.
- Pray that all members of local churches will reveal the Father's tangible love through acceptance and compassionate care, especially towards those wounded by rejection.

Practical tip

Notice someone often overlooked. Listen to them, give encouragement and remind them that they matter, and are deeply valued and loved.

TUESDAY 1 SEPTEMBER 2026

LOVE THAT DRAWS NEAR

..."Yes, I have loved you with an everlasting love; therefore with lovingkindness I have drawn you."
(Jeremiah 31:3).

The Father's everlasting love draws people towards Him. In a generation marked by loneliness, rejection and distant relationships, His love assures us that we are wanted and welcomed. As we draw near to Him, His love enables us to draw near to others with genuine compassion and care.

Let us pray

- Invite the Holy Spirit to enable you to reflect the Father's welcoming love by intentionally drawing near to someone who feels lonely, excluded or forgotten.
- Pray that local churches will embrace newcomers and lonely people, creating a loving community where they experience belonging and the Father's care.

Practical tip

Invite someone for coffee or a conversation and give them your undivided attention.

WEDNESDAY 2 SEPTEMBER 2026

LOVE FOR THE FATHERLESS

A father of the fatherless, a defender of widows, is God in His holy habitation. (Psalm 68:5).

Many children and young people grow up without the security of a loving father. Others have fathers who are physically present but emotionally distant. Our heavenly Father reveals His compassionate heart towards those who feel abandoned, rejected or unwanted. Through His Church, His fatherly love can become visible and tangible.

Let us pray

- Ask the Lord to give you His heart for those who lack loving parental support and to show you how to encourage, support and care for them practically.
- Pray that churches and youth ministries will embrace the fatherless, helping them encounter the Father's love, acceptance and belonging.

Practical tip

Encourage a young person today through sincere words, prayer or practical support.

THURSDAY 3 SEPTEMBER 2026

LOVE THAT GIVES

"For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son..." (John 3:16).

The Father demonstrated His love by giving His Son for us. His love is not merely expressed in words; it gives sacrificially and responds to the needs of others. When we receive His love, the Holy Spirit enables us to become generous with our time, attention and resources.

Let us pray

- Surrender your time, attention and resources to the Lord, asking Him to make you generous and willing to meet the practical needs of others.
 - Pray that local believers will recognise and compassionately respond to practical needs within their congregations and communities.

Practical tip

Identify one practical need today and quietly do something to meet it, expecting nothing in return and allowing the Father's love to shine.

FRIDAY 4 SEPTEMBER 2026**LOVE THAT RESTORES**

"...But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him." (Luke 15:20).

Jesus revealed the Father's heart through the parable of the father who welcomed his lost son home with compassion. The Father does not turn away those who return to Him. His love forgives, restores dignity and welcomes people back into fellowship with Him.

Let us pray

- Ask the Father to form His restoring heart within you, enabling you to welcome rather than judge those who have failed, wandered or need a new beginning.
- Pray that local congregations will lovingly receive and restore those returning to Christ, helping them rediscover belonging and spiritual family.

Practical tip

Reach out to someone who has withdrawn or drifted away from church. Encourage them without judgement.

SATURDAY 5 SEPTEMBER 2026**LOVE THAT CORRECTS**

For whom the LORD loves He corrects, just as a father the son in whom he delights. (Proverbs 3:12).

The Father's love does not leave us unchanged. He lovingly corrects and shapes us because He desires Christlike character in His children. His correction flows from relationship rather than rejection. Receiving His loving correction teaches us to guide others with truth, patience and grace, rather than condemnation.

Let us pray

- Humble yourself before the Father, receiving His loving correction and asking Him to help you guide others with truth, grace and compassion.
- Pray that church leaders will correct and disciple believers with wisdom and love, helping them grow in Christlike character.

Practical tip

When correction is necessary, speak truth gently and encourage rather than condemn, always seeking to restore rather than wound the other person.

SUNDAY 6 SEPTEMBER 2026

LOVE MADE VISIBLE

"By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:35).

The Father's love becomes tangible when His children demonstrate it towards others. A hurting generation needs more than words about His love; they need to encounter it through believers who show compassion, kindness and genuine care. The Church should be a living expression of His heart.

Let us pray

- Offer yourself to the Lord as an expression of His love, asking Him to make His compassion visible through your words, actions and selfless care.
- Pray that local churches will become communities where Christ's love is clearly demonstrated, drawing hurting and lonely people towards Him.

Practical tip

Ask the Lord to show you someone who needs His love today and then respond in practical ways.
